Become an APA-Certified ACT Parent Group Facilitator!

The ACT Northeast Regional Training Center trains and certifies professionals who work with families of young children, many of whom come from backgrounds in early education, psychology, domestic violence counseling, social work, healthcare and community development. These trained professionals return to their organizations and lead the ACT RSK parent program in their own communities with the support and technical assistance of the ACT Northeast Office.

What Facilitators Get

The two-day workshop features interactive discussions, both small and large group work, and topic presentations. Participants will:

- Receive the current research on risk factors and protective factors for violence and its consequences on children's lives
- Learn how to teach parents skills for effective parenting such as anger management, conflict resolution, positive discipline and media violence education
- Receive a certificate of attendance for 16 hours of professional development credit
- Be prepared to participate in communitywide violence prevention efforts with a support network of professionals
- Be able to continue to gain certification as a Certified APA-ACT Facilitator



What Parents & Caregivers Learn

The 8-week *ACT Raising Safe Kids Program* is taught in a fun, interactive learning environment through short lectures, slide presentations, videos, experiential activities, group discussions, small-group work and role-play. The program is culturally sensitive and can be taught in diverse settings. The class includes:

- Ways to help children manage anger and other emotions
- How violence affects children's development, behavior and self-esteem
- How children's behavior is shaped by their age and temperament
- Basic facts about child development, parenting styles, positive discipline and conflict resolution skills
- The difference between discipline and punishment
- Safety with media (internet, TV, video games, etc.)
- Reflections on parents' own care-giving values

The ACT Raising Safe Kids Program uses interactive adult learning strategies to help adults learn how to reinforce children's good behavior, build their self-esteem and foster loving relationships in families, all of which helps to prevent violence in the lives of young children before it starts.

Parents receive useful handouts to take home, a certificate showing they successfully completed the program, a graduation celebration during the last class, and a support network of parents & caregivers.



About the ACT Northeast Regional Training Center

The ACT-NE Regional Training Center is a program of the American Psychological Association, managed by Lemberg Children's Center, located on the Brandeis University campus in Waltham, MA. One of five regional ACT centers around the nation, the ACT-NE center serves New York, New Jersey and New England. The central office is at the American Psychological Association head-quarters in Washington, DC.

The ACT-NE Center trains professionals from the Northeast region who work with families with young children to facilitate their own ACT parent groups in their local communities. The center:

- Holds the two-day ACT facilitator training several times a year at Brandeis University
- Is available to travel to other locations in the Northeast to hold facilitator trainings
- Connects professionals to ACT community coordinators in NY, NJ and New England to set up local facilitator training sessions and parent group programs

The ACT-NE Center also runs an ACT Raising Safe Kids parent program for the Lemberg, Brandeis and Waltham communities.

The ACT Raising Safe Kids Program, designed by the American Psychological Association, trains and certifies professionals who work with families of young children to teach the RSK curriculum in their local communities.

The ACT Raising Safe Kids Program is continuously updated and improved. An evidence-based approach with pre- and post-program evaluations gathers qualitative and quantitative data about the program's impact and effectiveness in shifting participants' knowledge, skills and attitudes as a result of participating in the program. In addition, new studies and findings are often reflected in the core curriculum of the RSK program.
